Positive Impact

For years, UMMC has offered outstanding care while making do with exam rooms that are uncomfortably small and an MRI machine that's more than 20 years old and sits inside a freight trailer. Right-sizing and upgrading the equipment in the radiology department means patients and their medical teams will benefit from better imaging, less radiation and more efficient turnaround times for testing. Plus, visitors will have easier, more direct access to the department, which treats a growing number of patients each year.

Investment

Expanding and updating equipment in the radiology department will cost **\$11 million**. The expansion will be completed by the end of 2021, and renovations will be completed by the end of 2022.
